Participants discussed and agreed as follows:

1. South Africa: State will seek an update of South African intentions with respect to possible criminal investigations/prosecutions in advance of its proposed early December trip to Pretoria. [State]

2. Intelligence Coordination: 1.4(c) ATF, and other members of the 1.4(c) law enforcement communities as appropriate, will meet no later than November 29 to compare notes on VBO, with the intention of presenting to policymakers an all-source consensus USG view of current VBO activities in South Africa in advance of the proposed early December Statelead trip to Pretoria. 1.4(c) ATF]

3. Interpol: FBI will convey to Interpol the interest of USG policymakers in discussing VBO with its Lyon-based agent during his upcoming visit to the United States. [FBI]

2. Visas: State will convene, by no later than November 29, a small group meeting to review progress on visa-related issues. Among other things, State, working with the intelligence and law enforcement communities, will ensure that its list of VBO associates for out-of-channel visa processing is current, and that all relevant individuals have been entered into the TIPOFF/LOOKOUT systems as appropriate. State will also ensure that TIPOFF/LOOKOUT hits for Butt and associates are promptly notified to ATF. Finally, State will provide copies of Naydo and Manik visa applications to ATF and other interested agencies. [STATE, 1.4(c) ATF and other agencies as appropriate]





We have an evil arms dealer named Victor Butt who has networks across Africa and is effectively fuelling Angola, Sierra Leone and the Congo. We also have A LOT of intell on him. Following a briefing from them, I have asked Nora Dempsey and Cathy Byrne in my office to put together a draft strategy for shutting down his network, which they are very eager to do since they have been following him around for months and he keeps messing up their portfolios. Dick - who in your office is the get-evil-arms-dealers person, that they might touch base with? Maureen - do you think you can offer any insights or ideas into this?

Nora and Cathy are quite determined and I am convinced that if we simply turned them loose with my frequent flier miles and a hammer they could take care of this. However - want to know what legal, diplomatic, and other tools we may have at our disposal. If this network could be shut down it would be huge for Africa, both in the specific sense of his operations, but also in the bigger picture.

BACKGROUND

Despite our clear warnings of U.S. action should he persist in fueling the civil war in Sierra Leone, Charles Taylor has continued to arm the RUF and direct RUF operations. With Taylor's support, the RUF has recently expanded its operations along the Liberia-Guinea border. Simultaneously, Taylor is trying harder to conceal his support of the RUF. Over the past month, he has engaged in a diplomatic charm offensive, hoping to convince regional leaders he is working hard to steer the RUF towards a peaceful settlement.

Consistent with the Deputies' August 7 agreement to look for ways to speed up implementation of sanctions against Liberia, an IWG on Liberian sanctions has examined several follow-on measures to the visa restrictions announced October 11. These measures are elaborated on below. They fall into two categories: measures which would be most effectively pursued multilaterally and unilateral measures. We had initially considered awaiting the report of a UN Sierra Leone Sanctions Committee Expert Panel. However, that report has been delayed and Taylor's support for the RUF continues. While we may not obtain UNSC support for all of the proposed multilateral sanctions against Liberia, we should press ahead seeking support for as a broad range of measures as possible in order to hasten the end of Taylor's support for the RUF.

In addition to the multilateral approach to Liberian sanctions, State believes we must also pursue additional unilateral measures. Such sanctions could derive from legal authority provided in the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA), the Foreign Missions Act, or the Export Administration Act (State Sponsor of Terrorism). IEEPA provides the President broad legal authority to impose sanctions such as restrictions on Liberia's U.S.-based maritime registry, an import embargo, a financial assets freeze, or a ban on new direct U,S. investment. However, absent a UN resolution calling for international sanctions, some agencies question whether Taylor's continued support for the RUF meets the criteria for a Presidential emergency declaration invoking IEEPA

The U.S. should seek a UN Security Council resolution that C bans the importation of diamonds from Liberia. The resolution would permit the lifting of the embargo when the Secretary-General reported to the UNSC that non-government forces had been

disarmed and demobilized and that the GOSL had reestablished control over all Sierra Leone territory. We would seek to designate an experts panel to investigate violations of the Liberian arms and diamond embargoes. State believes that an outright ban on all'Liberian diamonds is the only effective way to deprive Taylor of resources used to support the RUF.

UNSCR 788 (1992) established an arms embargo in the midst of the Liberian civil war which remains in force but is flouted by Taylor despite a sanctions committee (chaired by Namibia, which leaves the Council at the end of December) established under UNSCR 985 (1995). Paradoxically, efforts to reinforce this ban could destroy it, as UNSC members may question the need to continue or enforce the ban when the Liberian civil war for which it was enacted has ended.

UNSCR 1132 (1997) established a Sierra Leone sanctions committee (chaired by Bangladesh) which was subsequently charged with monitoring the arms embargo imposed on the RUF in UNSCR 1171 (1998). This committee is also concerned about links between illicit arms and diamonds trafficking as noted in UNSCR 1306 (July 5, 2000), which imposed a diamond embargo on Sierra Leone. The report of the experts panel, which has traveled to Europe and Africa, will guide the committee's efforts to curb the illicit trade. We will work with both committees to tighten the arms embargo on Liberia.

Taylor has proposed allowing border monitors to investigate reports of arms shipments to the RUF from Liberia. Our initial assessment is that this would be prohibitively costly and difficult to perform. Monitors dispersed in remote locations would be dubiously effective and make an easy target for hostage taking.

On the broader question of border monitors, however, the October 3 ECOWAS Mediation and Security Council ministerial agreed to deploy a military observer mission along the borders of Guinea, Liberia, and Sierra Leone to quell tensions in the region. Such a deployment requires a decision by ECOWAS Heads of State, at either an Extraordinary Executive Session or regular Summit (currently scheduled for December). It would also require significant external financing.

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Taylor has requested technical assistance to enhance monitoring of Liberia's air and seaports. We could counterpropose that international monitors be placed at Liberian air and arhord seaports. As an adjunct responsibility, some monitors might be able to provide the technical assistance Taylor has requested. Funding would, however, have to come from voluntary contributions. The program could be conducted under UN auspices when or, alternatively, through ECOWAS.

USUN reports that Council members are likely to oppose 7 monitoring as costly and ineffective, citing previous attempts at international arms monitoring and the FRY. An ineffective system of UN (or ECOWAS) monitoring would likely be easy for the Liberians to circumvent, and Taylor could use it to reinforce his claims that Liberia is not involved in illicit arms trafficking.

STATE POSITION

We should approach Security Council members with sanitized information to demonstrate Taylor's role in supplying arms to the RUF and build the case for tightening the existing arms embargo on Liberia. State should prepare a series of strong bilateral demarches to countries wittingly or unwittingly involved in sanctions violations.

The USG should decline Taylor's offer of border monitoring as impractical and counterpropose placement of international monitors/trainers at air and seaports. If Taylor accepts our counterproposal, USUN will seek to include in a UNSC resolution authorization to place monitors at Liberian air and seaports to enforce the arms embargo. This effort would need to be funded by voluntary contributions (need to identify source of U.S. contribution and consult with Congress) and might be UNadministered. While costly, we believe these monitors would send an important signal to Taylor that the UNSC is serious about enforcing the embargo, would raise the costs to Taylor and arms traffickers, and would help curb arms trafficking in the region.

3. TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS (VISA BAN)

DISCUSSION

We have begun pressuring Taylor and other RUF supporters with a unilateral visa ban, under authority of the U.S. Immigration and Nationality Act, announced October 11. The ban applies to those who support the RUF, regardless of nationality. We have instructed selected Embassies to approach key governments to try to internationalize travel restrictions on RUF supporters

The International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) provides broad legal authority for a range of possible economic sanctions, including a financial assets freeze, restrictions on the maritime registry, and halt to new investment. To invoke IEEPA, the President must issue an Executive Order declaring a national emergency based on "an unusual and extraordinary threat . . . to the national security, foreign policy, or economy of the United States" and identify prohibitions on economic activity by U.S. persons. To be effective, the scope of the Order should be broad enough to cover all assets under the control of Taylor, his advisers, and the GOL. Treasury/OFAC can subsequently license activities (such as the maritime registry) we might want to allow to continue while the Order is in place. Treasury requests that we defer further consideration of IEEPA and an assets freeze until discussed and approved by a Deputies meeting which includes Treasury.

As of 1998, cumulative U.S. direct investment in Liberia was \$228 million. We are seeking information on annual investment levels in recent years to quantify possible impact of a ban on new investment. We would need to seek information on the owners of Liberian assets in the U.S. that might be subject to the asset freeze.







OTHER REPORTS HAVE INDICATED THAT BUTT IS A KNOWN SANCTIONS VIOLATOR. FOR EXAMPLE, WE KNOW THAT IN JUNE 2000 BUTT WAS ARRANGING AIRLIFT FOR UNITA VIA MONROVIA.

IN ADDITION, THE REPORT OF THE PANEL OF EXPERTS ON VIOLATIONS OF UN SECURITY COUNCIL SANCTIONS AGAINST ANGOLA SPECIFICALLY NAMED VICTOR BUTT AS A NOTORIOUS SANCTIONS VIOLATOR. THE REPORT STATED (P. 13, PARA 29), "IN ADDITION TO INTERSTATE AIRWAYS, A COMPANY NAMED AIR CESS TOGETHER WITH ITS SISTER COMPANY AIR PASS ARE KNOWN TO HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN THE SMUGGLING OF COMMODITIES FROM SOUTH AFRICA TO UNITA CONTROLLED AREAS. A FOOTNOTE TO THAT PARAGRAPH ADDS, "VICTOR BOUT IS KNOWN TO OPERATE WITH A NUMBER OF PARTNERS, SOME OF WHCM ARE ALSO BELIEVED TO BE INVOLVED IN SANCTIONS BUSTING ON BEHALF OF UNITA. AS NOTED IN THE PANEL'S RECOMMENDATIONS, FURTHER INVESTIGATION AND EXPOSURE OF THESE CONNECTIONS SHOULD BE A HIGH PRIORITY FOR FUTURE SANCTIONS ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS. IN ORDER TO ASSIST THESE EFFORTS, THE PANEL WILL MAKE AVAILABLE TO THE SANCTIONS COMMITTEE PERTINENT INFORMATION THAT HAS ALREADY BEEN COLLECTED. "

SIERRA LEONE (RUF): RESOLUTION 1171 (1998) PLACED AN EMBARGO ON ARMS SHIPMENTS TO THE RUF. Summary of Recent BUTT activity

This summary includes the major known activities of Victor Butt over the past several months. While most of Butt's activities deal with small arms it has recently come to light that he is in the market for larger armaments and systems.

Butt delivered 2 Mi-8T military helicopters and associated rockets to Liberian President Taylor. (The shipment of the helicopters included 57mm air to surface rockets). (July 2000)

- Butt associates deal with Bulgarian Peter Mirchev, Managing Director of the Bulgarian consortium KAS Engineering. This included deals to sell Mirchev 2 Mi-8 helicopters, an Mi-8T and a Mi-8MT. (July-August 2000).
- DROC Rebel Group receives shipment of military supplies. Supplies arrived to President Jean-Pierre Bemba (Congolese Liberation Movement). Cargo included unidentified anti aircraft equipment and mine shooting equipment. (August 2000)
- July 2000 Butt and his associates arranged a shipment of air defense equipment, bombs and ammunition to Monrovia. SL rebels are the ultimate recipient of some of these weapons. (July 2000)
 - Butt was considering the purchase of a wide variety of aircraft, weapons systems and munitions. This represents a broadening of his interests to include the acquisition and proliferation of larger weapons such as multiple rocket launcher systems. It is believed significant that Butt apparently has the necessary connections to have weapons systems, namely the MRLS built to his or his customer's specifications. While specific destinations for the equipment is unknown, it is undoubtedly destined for African countries.
 - It is believed that the MRLS would be a BM-21 122mm GRAD MRLS with the option for mounting it on a Czech Tatra chassis (8 wheeled very large chassis). (July 2000).
 - Butt and associated have referred to the MRLS as a small NEPOGODA (bad weather). Weapons systems which have names referring to bad weather include SMERCH, URAGAN and GRAD (tornado, hurricane and hail respectively). There are all multiple rocket launcher equipped systems: the 300mm SMERCH MRLS, the BM-22 220mm URAGAN MRLS and the BM-21 122mm GRAD MRLS. Since it was described as small, it is assumed to be the BM-21 GRAD MRLS.
 - Butt is also interested in SAMs, air to ground rockets, anti-tank guided missiles (ATGM) and mines.

It is probably that Butt delivered up to 160 tons of ammunition to Liberia. Ruprah and Butt arranged to supply to Liberia ammunition based on a list of requirements provided to Ruprah by possibly President Charles Taylor. This includes rounds of AK-47 ammunition, RPG-7V ammunition, 7.62-54 ammunition. Possibly sent cargo lots of 40 tons (max cargo capacity of Il-76). 4 flights at 40 tons = 60 tons (July 2000)

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
- Jean-Pierre Bemba, Chairman of the DROC rebel group the Congolese Liberation Movement (MLC) agreed on March 15, 2000 to lease 3 transport aircraft and one helicopter from Butt. A Yakovlev 40, a LET 410, an Antonov-28 and an Mi-8 PS for several months.
- Butt was expected to have approval from the Ukrainian Presidential Policy Committee on Military-Technical Cooperation and Export Control regarding a contract with the Ukrainian State Arms Export Company, Ukrspetsexport. The contract was for unspecified goods to be purchased from Ukrspetsexport which were apparently destined for Rwanda. Able to circumvent UN resolution. (September 2000)
- Butt made first contact with an official Russian state arms export company (Federal State Unitary Enterprise "Promexport.") (July 2000)
- UAE based Transavia Travel Agency a company owned by Butt is facilitating operations of a Libyan-registered aircraft in Tripoli. Many of the flights are associated with VIP travel. This is also the way the hostages were transported from the Philippines to Libya. (Summer 2000)
- Butt has a company in Moscow.
- Payment info: Ruprah seeking to transfer funds from a NY banking company to the account of San Air Gneral Trading in Sharjah. Request for USD 400,000 to be transferred. A US citizen based in VA was asked to arrange the transfer. (Will get you more info on recent transaction).
- Basic recent diamond info: Butt has received concessions to exploit diamonds in rebel held areas in DROC.

Mi-8 Helicopters are civilian helicopters Mi-8T is the military version of the Mi-8 model. The Mi-8T is identical to the Mi-17 It is not possible to officially export an Mi-17 to Liberia. The only Mi-8 helicopters still being produced are military versions according to Butt associate.

Butt has 4 more identical helicopter models available. Original helicopter batch was of 6 Mi-87 helicopters. One was destroyed. One sent to Liberia. 4 more available. All had between 45-50% service time left before an engine overhaul would be necessary.

Liberia: Gray Market Helicopter Will Aid Rebels in Sierra Leone (S#NF)



(TS/____NF) Liberia's acquisition this month of a military helicopter and associated armaments will improve Liberia's ability to support Revolutionary United Front (RUF) operations against UN and Sierra Leonean Government forces. <u>1.4(c)</u> indicates that a Liberia-based arms broker worked with air transporter Victor Butt to buy an Mi-8T helicopter from unidentified suppliers, and imagery shows the helicopter arrived in Monrovia this week.

/NF) The Mi-8T has a larger 1.4 (c)

capacity than the Mi-2s that Monrovia now is using to supply the RUF. President Taylor could use the Mi-8T to strike directly at Sierra Leonean forces that threaten his control of key diamond areas but would hesitate to deploy it against UN forces for fear of international condemnation. <u>1.4(c)</u> indicates the helicopter was to be accompanied by 100 "units" of unguided armaments, most likely 57-mm air-to-surface rockets, which could be for the Mi-8T or Liberia's three Mi-2 military helicopters.



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

The Wolf amendment was removed from the bill in the House. A similar measure is in the Senate CJS bill, which won't be considered until September. Our attitude toward both is "support the intent, but disagree with the method". State believes these provisions as drafted would undermine our international efforts to crack down on the trade in conflict diamonds, while Customs believes they are unenforceable.

We've said we are willing to keep discussing with them ways to accomplish

our shared objective, but have not settled on any alternative language yet.
