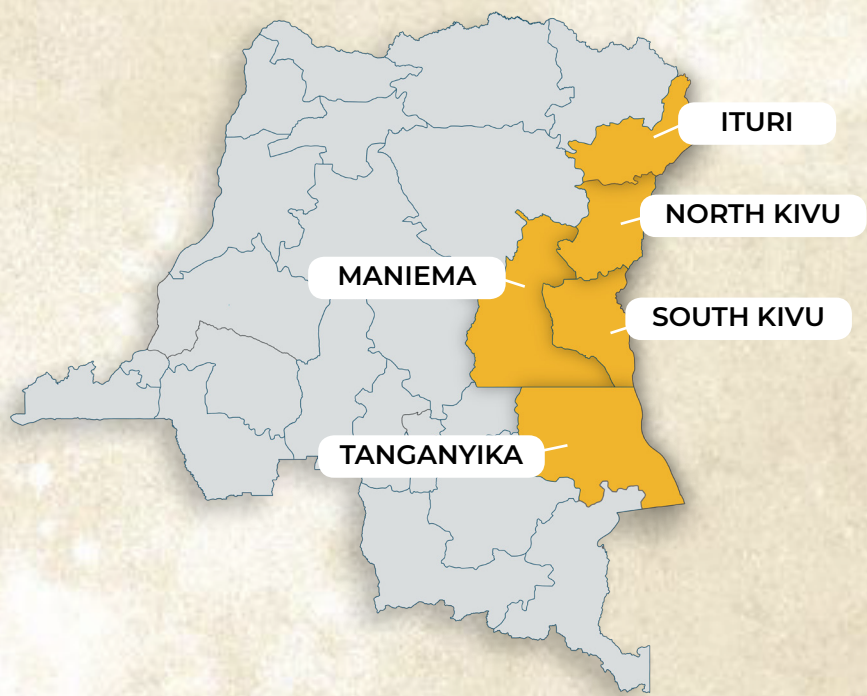


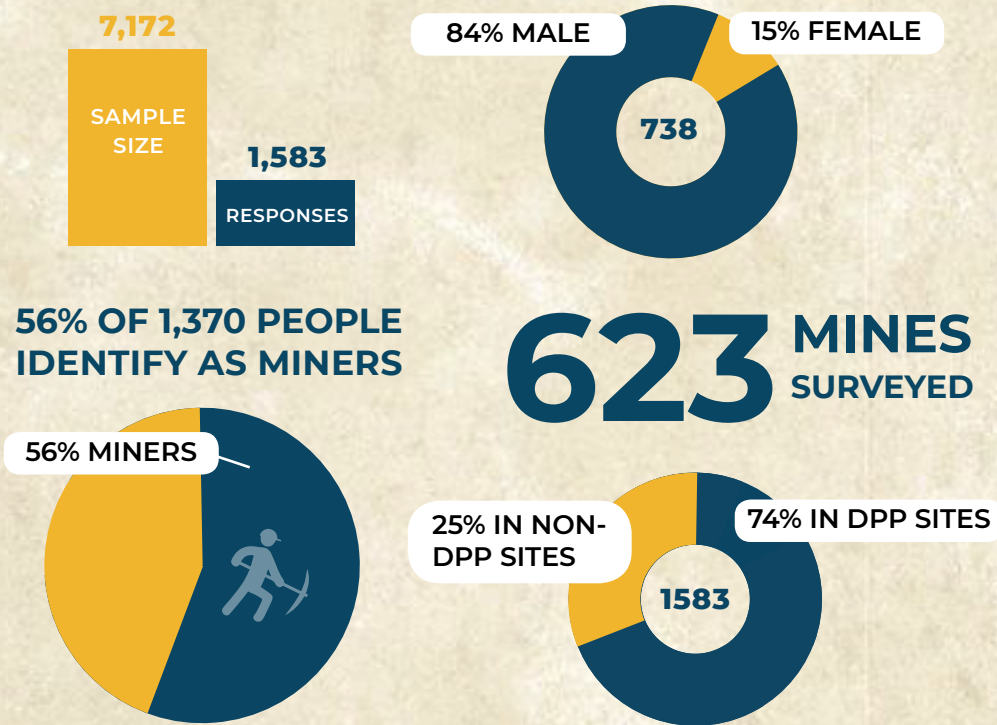

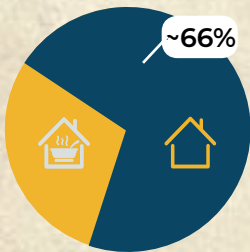


CHILD LABOUR

IDENTIFIED IN 16% OF 238 MINING SITES

INCOME

45% HAD DECREASED INCOME FROM LAST YEAR



TWO-THIRDS (~66%) OF THE RESPONDENTS REPORTED BEING UNABLE TO FEED, CLOTHE AND HOUSE THEMSELVES OR THEIR FAMILIES WITH THEIR CURRENT INCOMES.

FORCED LABOUR



20% OF PEOPLE WHO IDENTIFIED AS MINERS ARE WORKING TO PAY OFF SOME KIND OF DEBT



VIOLENCE

34% OF REPORTED VIOLENCE IN DDP AND NON-DPP SITES IS PERPETRATED BY PEOPLE WHO WORK FOR POLICE AND GOVERNMENT SERVICES

HEALTH, SAFETY AND ENVIRONMENT



MERCURY IS USED IN 35% OF GOLD MINING SITES REPRESENTING OVER 2/3 OF THE SURVEYED MINES



52% OF RESPONDENTS WHO REPORTED WITNESSING OR HEARING ABOUT MINE ACCIDENTS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE ACCIDENT RESULTED IN SOMEONES DEATH
